A Word from Matt,

One of the things that has always amazed me about how Jesus interacted with people is that He would often answer a question with a question. When the rich young ruler asked Him what must he do to inherit eternal life, Jesus responded with, how do you read what is written in the law? The reason Jesus does this is because questions have power. We ask questions when we want to get to know someone. We may ask them where they are from or what they do for a career, or we may just ask the simple question of how are you doing. The truth is that questions have power, and a well-timed question can unlock deep truths.

In John 5, Jesus encounters a crippled man laying by the Pool of Bethesda who has been crippled for 38 years. When Jesus sees this man, He asks him what we may consider an obvious question. Jesus asks this man, "Do you want to be well?" We may see a story like this and assume that this man wants to be healed but his response to Jesus's question is very telling. This man responds with an excuse that he has no one to help him. Notice, that he doesn't answer Jesus's question, he instead makes an excuse. This is the power of questions. With one question, Jesus revealed what lay at the heart of this man's condition. While he was physically crippled, he was also spiritually crippled in that he could not see that the solution to his problem was standing in front of him in the person of Jesus.

I want to ask you a simple question if we are honest with ourselves can have profound implications. Do we want to see God's best in our lives? Before we answer with a quick yes, let me explain why that question is harder than expected. To experience God's best means accepting that our desires and God's desires are not always the same. We may assume that what we want for ourselves is best, but God's ways are always higher than our ways. Having God's best in our lives means we have to get out of the way, and we have to trust that God really does know what is best. We have to stop resisting the work that God wants to do in our lives and instead, we have to trust that God can bring true healing to our souls. We also have to stop making excuses. Too many times we make excuses or blame others for why things are the way they are in our lives.

If you want to see God's best in your life, you have to be honest with yourself about where you are right now. Is there a sin in your life you need to confess? Is there an area where you need to trust God? Is there a decision God wants you to make that you have avoided because you know it won't be easy? Do you need to refocus your priorities to align with what God wants?

As we journey together, let us always make it our desire that God's best is best and that we won't settle for anything less. Let us be honest with ourselves and do what needs to be done so that God can be glorified in every area of our lives. Let us seek Him above all else and let us be content with what He provides because God is always good, and He always does good.
